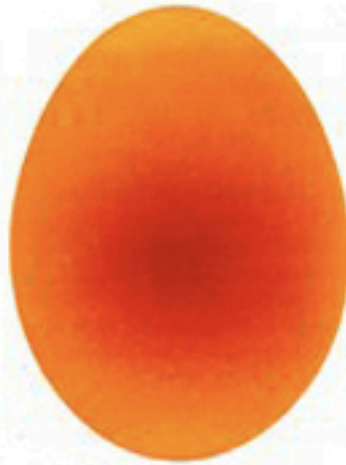


How to tell if your eggs are Fresh?

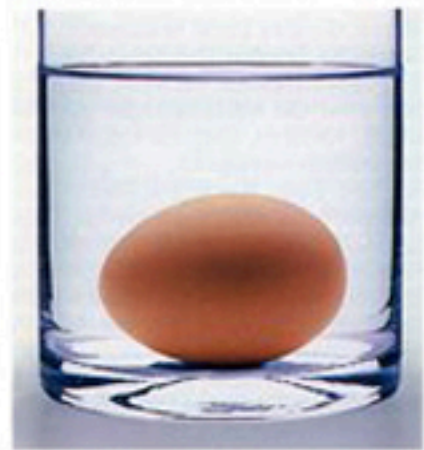
1 day old EGG



the yolk has a nice, round structurally tough shape, surrounded by a more structural egg white ring and another thinner outer egg white ring.

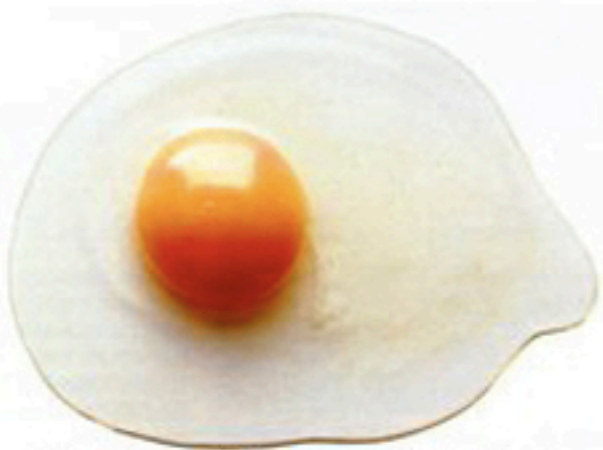


the yolk shows a very soft shadow when held against light. can not see the air chamber on the thick end of the egg.

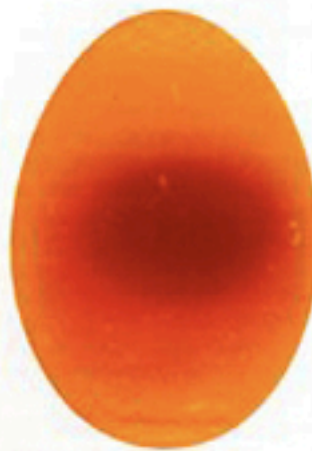


the egg does not float and sinks to the bottom.

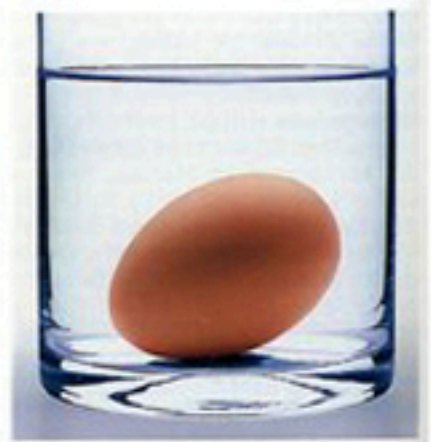
7 days old EGG



the yolk is still nice and rounded, the white expanded slightly but still retaining round structure.



the air chamber inside has expanded a little, can see the soft shadow of yolk and white as two layers when held against light.

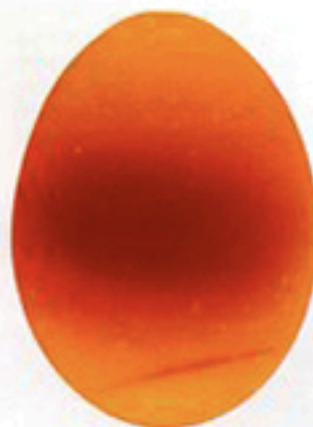


the air chamber starts to expand a little at the thick end of the egg causing the thick end of the egg to float a little in water.

2 - 3 weeks old EGG



the yolk has flattened, and the albumen is watery and runny. at this stage the egg needs to be thoroughly cooked.



hold the egg in front of strong light. the egg yolk moves when the egg is turned.



an egg at this age will stand up with the rounded end upwards due to the expansion of the air-cell. the air-cell will continue to expand to make the egg buoyant as it gets older.
